## How to Write Congratulations Messages That Feel Genuine (Not Generic)

Great congratulations messages do two things: name the milestone and honor the effort behind it. Whether you're writing to a coworker, friend, or family member, use a simple formula that keeps your message personal without overthinking it.

The "3-Part Congrats" formula

1. Celebrate the moment: "Congratulations on..."
2. Call out a specific strength: "You earned this through..."
3. Offer a forward-looking wish: "Can't wait to see what you do next".

### Quick personalization checklist

- Mention a detail (project, school, city, new role, timeline).
- Match tone (professional for colleagues, warm for family, playful for close friends).
- Keep it readable (1-3 sentences is often perfect).
- Add a "quote add-on" only if it fits their style.

## Short + Sweet Congratulations (Use for Any Milestone)

For a new job, emphasize fresh start and confidence. If you know the company or role, name it, one detail instantly makes your message feel thoughtful.

## Quote Add-Ons: 5 Options That Make Your Congratulations Message Feel Special

If the card feels "almost done", add a short quote after your message. Keep it to one quote max, and choose a line that matches the milestone (achievement, love, new beginnings).

### How to attach a quote without sounding forced

- Use a lead-in: "This made me think of you:"
- Keep spacing clean: Write your message, then add the quote on a new line.
- Optional closer: "So proud of you", / "Cheering you on", / "With love",

## Step-by-Step Templates (Fill-in-the-Blank)

When you're not sure what to say, these fill-in templates make it easy to write congratulations messages that sound like you.

1. Simple & sincere: "Congratulations on [milestone]! You earned this through [strength/effort]. Wishing you [positive next step]".
2. Professional (email/LinkedIn): "Congratulations on [milestone]. I've appreciated your [skill] on [project/team], and I'm excited to see your impact in [new role/next phase]".
3. Close friend: "I'm so proud of you for [what they overcame]. Congratulations on [milestone], let's celebrate with [plan]".
4. Family: "Congratulations, [name]. Watching you [grow/commit/finish] has been a joy. You deserve [wish]".

Common mistakes to avoid

- Making it about you: Keep "I" statements short and supportive.
- Overdoing praise: One strong compliment beats five vague ones.
- Assuming details: If the situation is sensitive (job change, graduation plans), stay positive without guessing.
